Baloch militant group releases pics of 2 women suicide attackers on Pak ISI camps

BALOCH : (AGENCY)

The banned Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) has released photos of two female suicide attackers involved in a large-scale militant assault across Pakistan's Balochistan province, one of the deadliest incidents in recent years. One has been identified as Hawa Baloch, whose father was a BLA fighter killed by Pakistani security forces in 2021, and the other Asifa Mengal, born in 2002, who carried out the suicide attack on the alleged ISI camp in Nushki. Both Gen Z women were educated before joining the insurgency, reflecting the growing trend of young, educated women participating in the decades-long Baloch separatist movement. The attacks come amid heightened violence in Balochistan, where the BLA has been targeting security installations and public spaces as part of its campaign against the Pakistani state. The banned Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) has released photographs of two suicide attackers involved in a deadly and coordinated assault across Pakistan's Balochistan province. Both attackers were women, a development that highlights a significant and disturbing shift in the tactics used by Baloch insurgent groups. The BLA claimed responsibility for the attacks, which it described as part of the second phase of its operation named "Herof" (Black Storm), targeting Pakistani

security forces across the province. One of the attackers has been identified as 24-year-old Asifa Mengal, daughter of Mohammad Ismail and a resident of Nushki district. According to the BLA, Mengal was born on October 2, 2002, joined the group's elite suicide unit, the Majeed Brigade, on her 21st birthday, and volunteered for a "fidayee" (suicide) mission in January 2024. The militant group claimed that she carried out an attack targeting the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) headquar-

ters in Nushki. The identity of the second woman attacker has not yet been disclosed. A video released by the BLA shows the second female attacker, Hawa Baloch, moments before the assault, standing alongside armed male militants. Speaking in Balochi, she is seen mocking the Pakistani government, accusing it of oppressing Baloch women while lacking the ability to confront insurgents directly. In the footage, she calls on the Baloch population to awaken and unite with Baloch fighters, rejecting

heightened violence in Balochistan, where the BLA has been targeting security installations and public spaces as part of its campaign against the Pakistani state.

any compromise with the Pakistani state. The video has drawn attention for its propaganda value and the prominent role given to women in militant messaging. The coordinated attacks, which began on Friday night and continued into Saturday, killed nearly 50 people, including at least 17 security personnel. Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif confirmed that two of the attacks involved female perpetrators. Following the assaults, Pakistani security forces launched a massive counter-operation lasting nearly 40 hours. Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti said that more than 140 militants had been killed so far, adding that intelligence agencies.

Sheikh Hasina, relatives sentenced to prison terms after trial in absentia

A Bangladesh court on Monday sentenced deposed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to 10 years in jail in two separate corruption cases related to alleged irregularities in allocations of land in a government housing project. Dhaka's Special Judge's Court Handed 79-year-old Hasina 10 years of rigorous imprisonment for using her official influence in allocating residential plots to others, including her niece, UK Labour MP and former British minister Tulip Siddiq, under the Rajuk New Town Project in Purbachol on the outskirts of the capital Judge Robiul Alam simultaneously handed down Hasina's two nieces and a nephew, to different prison terms. Siddiq's younger sister, Azaman Siddiq and brother Radwan Mujib Siddiq Bobby were sentenced to seven years rigorous imprisonment, while the deposed premier



and her relatives were handed down the prison terms after trial in absentia. Only one of the 16 accused, a senior official of Rajuk, which allocates the plots, Khurshid Alam, was tried in person and was present at the court as the verdict was delivered. The others accused in the case were sentenced to five years' imprisonment, including a former junior minister for housing, a former secretary of the ministry, a former Rajuk chairman and officials of the state-run entity. "The trial of the accused

was not obstructed regardless of where they (accused) were in the world," the judge said while delivering the verdict. Hasina's now disbanded Awami League has labelled the sentences as "entirely predictable" and "false cases" staged by Muhammad Yunus' interim government, while it earlier called the charges "Fabricated" and "Malicious". The British lawmaker, on the other hand, said the process had been "flawed and farcical from the beginning to the end". "I'm absolutely baffled by the whole thing - I've still had no contact whatsoever from the Bangladeshi authorities despite them spreading malicious allegations about me for a year-and-a-half now," BBC quoted her as saying. "There's been absolutely no summons sent to me, there's no charge sheet, I've had no correspondence from them - I'm not difficult to find, I'm a parliamentarian."

Police officer killed, another critically wounded in shooting at Georgia hotel

LAWRENCEVILLE : (AGENCY)

A man being questioned by police at a suburban Atlanta hotel on Sunday shot the two officers after inviting them into his room, killing one of them and seriously wounding the other,



authorities said. The shooting suspect also was shot by one of the officers and was undergoing medical treatment and expected to survive, Gwinnett County Police Chief JD McClure said during a news conference. The shootout happened on Sunday morning near Stone Mountain, about 25 miles (40 km) northeast of Atlanta. The officers were dispatched to a hotel after a caller reported that a person staying there had used "fraud or a forgery" to rent a room, the police chief said. He said the suspect greeted the officers at the door to his room and invited them

inside. "They began discussing the scenario or the incident with him," McClure said. "And at some point the suspect produced a handgun and, in an unprovoked attack, fired at our Gwinnett County police officers." Officer Pradeep Tamang, 25, died from his injuries at a hospital, McClure said. A native of Nepal, Tamang had joined the police department last year. Office David Reed was hospitalized in serious but stable condition.

Sunday afternoon, the police chief said.

"This is the latest reminder of the dangers law enforcement face on a daily basis, and we are grateful for every one that puts themselves in harm's way to protect their fellow Georgians," Gov Brian Kemp said on the social media platform X. McClure identified the shooting suspect as 35-year-old Kevin Andrews. It was not immediately known whether Andrews had an attorney who could comment on his behalf. The investigation was being turned over to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, which customarily handles shootings involving.

Dalai Lama, K-pop win first Grammys, Steven Spielberg achieves EGOT status

The 68th annual Grammy Awards are taking place on Sunday and spirits were high from the jump after a few back-to-back, history making moments. The Dalai Lama won his first Grammy for audio book, narration and storytelling recording, beating out Supreme Court Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson. You ready that correctly. "I am not the Daki Lama," Rufus Wainwright joked in an acceptance speech. "It was a privilege to participate on this project."

"Golden" from "KPop Demon Hunters" won song written for visual media at the Premiere Ceremony, marking the first time a K-pop act has won a Grammy. Songwriters delivered their acceptance speech in both English and Korean, highlighting the song's bilingual appeal. Music film went to "Music for John Williams," which means director Steven Spielberg has officially won his first Grammy. That makes him an EGOT winner - an artist with an Emmy, Grammy, Tony and Oscar. The Premiere Ceremony, a pre-telecast show held at the adjacent Peacock Theater, began with musician and host Darren Criss setting the



scene - giving out the first award of the day, for best pop/duo group performance to Cynthia Erivo and Ariana Grande for "Defying Gravity." They were not present to accept the award.

An impressive 86 Grammys will be handed out pre-broadcast. Yungblud won his first Grammy for rock performance for his cover of Black Sabbath's "Changes (live from Villa Park)," which he performed at Ozzy Osbourne's final show. Hardcore band Turnstile also won their first Grammy for rock album and later, metal performance. "To Baltimore, thank you, we love you," said frontman Brendan Yates. The Cure won alternative music performance but were unable to attend as they were attending the funeral of

Perry Archangelo Bamente, the Cure's longtime guitarist and keyboardist, who died last month. FKA twigs won her first Grammy for best dance/electronic album for "EUSEXUA," becoming only the second Black woman to win in the category. "I didn't expect to come up here. I was just so happy to be nominated," she said in her speech. "All the Latino kids in the hood watching, anything is possible," said rapper Lefty Gunplay, who also won his first Grammy for rap performance for his role on Kendrick Lamar's "TV Off." Earlier on, Edgar Barrera handed out some of the Latin music categories: Natalia Lafourcade won best Latin pop album for "Cancionera"; best Latin Rock or Alternative album to CA7RIEL & Paco Amoroso for "Papota." It is

their first win on their first nomination. In their speech, in Spanish, they thanked their home country of Argentina and all of Latin America. Musica Mexicana album (including Tejano) went to Carin Leon for "Pabla De To's (Seca)." It is his second win on his second nomination. It is a dramatically different tone than last year. The 2025 award show was completely reimaged and refocused to relief efforts following the devastating Los Angeles-area wildfires. In 2026, the focus has been placed once again on the music, where Kendrick Lamar, Lady Gaga, Bad Bunny and more will go head-to-head during the televised ceremony. The energy was high from minute one at the Premiere Ceremony: Earth, Wind & Fire gave a groovy opening performance of "Shining Star" with some help from Israel Houghton, Lila Ike, Grace Potter, Maggie Rose and Trombone Shorty. "That's how you start a show!" Recording Academy CEO and President Harvey Mason Jr. said in his opening remarks. "That's a statement. That's joy. That's resilience." There were many other performances as well: Zara Larsson brought her Swedish.

Here's why Rafah crossing is Gaza's lifeline to world

Before the war, the Rafah border crossing was Gaza's only gateway to the outside world not controlled by Israel. When Israeli troops seized it in May 2024, that gateway was shuttered. It has now reopened, Egyptian and Israeli officials said on Monday — but with tight restrictions. Only a trickle of Gaza's tens of thousands of wounded and sick Palestinians will be allowed out each day, Israel says. Still, the reopening shows that the ceasefire in the two-year war between Israel and Hamas is moving forward and provides a glimmer of hope for Palestinians seeking to leave the strip — and those wishing to return home. Rafah's



reopening will make it easier for Gazans to seek medical treatment, travel internationally or visit family in Egypt, which is home to tens of thousands of Palestinians. It could also help Gaza's devastated economy, as Palestinian-made olive oil and other products are widely sold in Egypt and throughout the Arab world. "We hope this will close off Israel's pretexts and open the crossing," said Abdel-Rahman Radwan, a Gaza City resident.
