1.60 Lakh Crore Push to Reshape Delhi’s Landscape

Delhi Chief Minister Smt. Rekha Gupta on Tuesday thanked Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari for launching a series of landmark road and connectivity projects across Delhi-NCR.

She said the Centre, under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji, has been working towards building a modern, world-class and future-ready infrastructure network for the capital, helping Delhi tackle long-standing issues such as traffic congestion and pollution. Speaking after a press briefing addressed by Union Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari,



the Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said Delhi's traffic situation would have been unimaginable today had the Centre not pushed ahead with the construction of expressways, elevated corridors, tunnels and signal-free road networks under the Union Minister's leadership.

CM Rekha Gupta Thanks Union Minister Nitin Gadkari



Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said that projects worth ₹1.31 lakh crore had already been sanctioned for the development of the Delhi-NCR region over the past 12 years. She noted that the Union Minister has now announced that the total value of completed, ongoing

and upcoming road infrastructure projects in the region has reached nearly ₹1.60 lakh crore. The Chief Minister made special mention of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway link project, calling it a historic gift for the capital. She said her experience during

the inspection of the corridor was remarkable and added that the project would ensure seamless connectivity between Delhi, Noida, Faridabad, Gurugram and Jewar Airport. During the briefing, the Union Minister also announced several major upcoming

projects linked to Delhi. These include a ₹3,500 crore six-lane project connecting UER-II with the Delhi-Dehradun Expressway, a ₹7,500 crore Noida-Faridabad high-speed corridor; the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra connectivity project, a ₹7,000 crore tunnel project from Shiv Murti to Nelson Mandela Marg, and a ₹5,000 crore elevated corridor from AIIMS to Mahipalpur-Gurugram. According to the Chief Minister, these projects will significantly reduce traffic pressure in the capital while strengthening regional connectivity. She also highlighted projects such as the Kalindi Kunj interchange and flyover, the Ashram-Badarpur six-lane corridor.

Delhi taxi drivers’ unions to go on 3-day strike from May 21 demanding fare hike

Commercial vehicle drivers' unions in Delhi are planning to go on a three-day strike from May 21 to 23, demanding a hike in taxi and auto fares in view of the increasing fuel prices. The All India Motor Transport Congress on Monday wrote to Delhi Lieutenant Governor Taranjit Singh Sandhu and Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, raising their demands.

Due to the continuously increasing prices of CNG, petrol and diesel, middle-class drivers are struggling to support their families. Therefore, in coordination with other organisations of Delhi, the 'Chaalak Shakti Union' has called for a Chakka Jam (strike) and appealed not to operate vehicles on May 21, 22 and 23, said Anuj Kumar Rathore, vice-president of the Chaalak Shakti Union. "If the government does not

immediately increase taxi fares and issue a notification within one or two weeks, this movement will be intensified into a large-scale protest, for which the Delhi government solely would be responsible, the union added. The drivers of commercial vehicles also stated that strong policies be formulated to stop the economic exploitation of taxi drivers. The union had to approach the Delhi High Court last year, which clearly directed that the problems of taxi drivers should be resolved and the taxi fare should be increased. Despite this, the Delhi government continues to make excuses and delay this matter by saying that the file has been sent to the Lieutenant Governor for approval.

Delhi govt to distribute summer kits having satttu, ORS, gamcha to 1 lakh construction workers

The Delhi government will distribute special kits containing satttu, ORS, sherbat syrup, prickly heat powder, gamcha and other items, among one lakh construction workers in the city to help them cope with the intense summer heat, officials said on Tuesday. The government has started the process to engage a public sector unit for procurement of the items, packaging and distribution of the summer kits to nearly one lakh workers registered with Delhi Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, they said.

Each kit will have nine items including 250 grams of instant energy glucose, one kg premium quality satttu (roasted gram flour), 30 oral rehydration solution (ORS) sachets, cotton gamcha (towel), sunlight protection cap, prickly heat



powder, one-litre water bottle, 250 ml of sherbat concentrate kept in a durable utility backpack. The approximate cost of distribution of each kit is estimated to be Rs 1,890. The Board has started the process for selection of a PSU for supply of summer kits to Delhi to the construction workers, officials said. The Delhi government recognises that construction workers engaged in outdoor and labour-intensive activities are particularly vulnerable to extreme summer conditions and heatwave related occupational risks such as dehydration, heat stress, fatigue, and associated health complications.

NDMC Chairman appeals to employees and citizens to use Green Mobility Options

NDMC Chairman Leads by Example, Adopts Metro Commute

In a commendable gesture reflecting commitment to sustainable practices and fiscal prudence, Shri Keshav Chandra - Chairman of New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) today chose to travel by Delhi Metro while commuting to office Palika Kendra in New Delhi. Responding to the call of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi Ji, for adopting austerity measures and reducing fuel consumption, Chairman, NDMC with his colleagues and Senior Officers undertook his journey from Lok Kalyan Marg Metro Station to Rajiv Chowk Metro Station via the Metro network and further took the Electric Auto to reach the Office. Upon reaching the office, Chairman, NDMC, also convened weekly Senior officers Meeting



(SoM) through virtual mode from the Headquarters, promoting the use of digital platforms to minimize travel and reduce fuel consumption among officers stationed outside the Headquarters building.

This initiative underscores NDMC's commitment to promoting environmentally responsible practices, reducing carbon footprint and encouraging the use of public transport among citizens and officials alike. By setting an example, the Chairman aims to

inspire a collective shift towards sustainable urban mobility and efficient resource utilization. On the occasion, Shri Chandra said that inspired by the nationwide appeal of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji towards fuel conservation, energy efficiency and promotion of clean, green and sustainable transportation, NDMC has launched several major green mobility initiatives to encourage eco-friendly transportation in the New Delhi as Heart of national

capital. Chairman, NDMC - Shri Chandra informed today that NDMC has decided to provide a special 50% concession in parking charges for Electric Vehicles (EVs) at all notified parking sites operated by NDMC, as compared to parking charges applicable for conventional petrol and diesel vehicles of the same category. The concession in parking charges for Electric Vehicles is already being implemented from 18th May 2026 and shall remain operational until further orders. Shri Chandra added Shri Chandra stated that this decision is a significant step towards realizing the vision of "Green Mobility" and "Sustainable Urban Transport." He said that the initiative would contribute towards fuel conservation, reduction in pollution and creation of a cleaner and greener environment in the Capital city.

Rekha Gupta Announces Special Collection Centres for Respectful Recycling of Damaged Idols in Delhi

Delhi Chief Minister Smt. Rekha Gupta on Tuesday announced a special public participation campaign for the respectful collection and recycling of damaged idols of Hindu deities across the Capital. As part of the initiative, the Delhi Government plans to establish dedicated collection centres for the dignified disposal and recycling of old and damaged idols.

The Chief Minister said the campaign would be entirely citizen-centric and invited suggestions directly from Delhi residents to help shape the final framework of the initiative through public participation. She noted that idols worshipped in homes for years are often abandoned under peepal trees, near riverbanks, in parks, or along roadsides once they become damaged.



According to her, this not only hurts religious sentiments but also raises serious concerns related to cleanliness and the environment. To address the issue, the Delhi Government will set up dedicated collection centres where people can respectfully deposit damaged idols. These idols will later be recycled using sci-

entific and environmentally sustainable methods and converted into useful items.

The idea is to ensure that religious faith is respected while environmental protection is also prioritised," the Chief Minister said, adding that the initiative should evolve into a people's movement rather than remain just a

government campaign. The Delhi Government is currently preparing a detailed action plan and has sought public feedback on the proposal. As part of the exercise, the Chief Minister has placed three key questions before citizens and appealed to them to share their suggestions. Residents have been asked to give their views on the initiative, suggest suitable locations for collection centres, such as in their wards, markets, or colonies and recommend ways to make the entire system more effective and dignified.

Delhi govt turns schools, community halls into summer shelters for attendants near major hospitals

With many patients' attendants spending nights outside hospitals in sweltering heat, the Delhi government has converted schools and community halls near four major hospitals into temporary summer shelters offering free stay and basic facilities.

An official told that shelters the Delhi Urban Shelter Improvement Board (DUSIB) initiative have opened near the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Lady Hardinge Medical College and Hospital, Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital and Safdarjung Hospital. Operational since May 15,



the facilities set up in schools and community halls of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) and the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC), will remain open until July 15. The official said many attendants, particularly those arriving from outside Delhi, are often forced to spend nights outside hospi-

tals, bus stands or on pavements due to financial constraints and lack of accommodation options.

During summer, several attendants stay outside hospitals and nearby public places in extreme heat conditions. These shelters aim to give them relief during the heatwave," he explained. The official said the shelters

are equipped with facilities similar to DUSIB night shelters, including beds, coolers, fans, meals, ORS packets, drinking water dispensers, mobile toilets and caretakers. "Since pagoda tents used during the winter season are not feasible during peak summer, temporary shelters have been set up in nearby schools and community centres," he said. DUSIB has put up posters inside the four hospitals to spread awareness about the facility, he said. Delhi recorded a minimum temperature of 28.2 degrees Celsius, 1.7 notches above the seasonal average. The weather department has predicted an orange alert for a heatwave lasting one week.

DDA issues fresh eviction notices in Yamuna Bazar area

The Delhi Development Authority has issued fresh eviction notices to all residents of Yamuna Bazar to vacate the area within 15 days. Following the earlier notice issued by the Delhi Disaster Management

Authority (DDMA), the DDA has pasted notices dated May 15 directing residents to vacate the area as it falls within the O-Zone category of the Yamuna floodplains. The notice issued earlier on May 5 had directed 310 residents to vacate the area within 15 days.
